At the end of November Guy filled in for a Pastor in Auckland, who went back to the States for a short furlough. We had an opportunity to minister to a group of Asian and Kiwi people. They have a true hunger for the word of God. We were also able to visit a lady whose husband, from the church, had a stroke and was in the hospital. In December a small group from our church went to a nursing home to sing Christmas Hymns and share the gospel message. We had the room packed with over 60 residents. They really enjoyed the hymns and we had opportunities to witness to several of them. Pray for fruit.

We sang several Christmas hymns and Guy encourages the people to let their light shine and to use every opportunity to give out the Gospel in the new year. We were blessed with a visit from a family, whose kids were in our church's children program for 7 years. They surprised us by driving an hour just to attend our services.

Because the people in our church were willing to get involved with Faith Promise Giving, we were able to vote to take on 2 new missionaries and increase the support of our other missionaries. We now support 8 missionaries. We were so excited to see the people step out on faith and give to see the Gospel spread.

We finished the year with our annual Heritage (Family) Camp that several like-minded churches attend. We had a great turnout with over 150 people in attendance. A great start to the New Year. In addition, we have found out that our daughter (Erin) is expecting another child!
