Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

February - March 2021

As of a few days ago, Scotland is officially out of the three week nation wide lockdown that ironically lasted 4 months. Praise the Lord, Brother Vogelpohl had found a new space to rent for the services right before this last lockdown started, and we've been able to keep the doors open for church and stay on the streets preaching. It has felt much like a ghost town in downtown Glasgow, which is normally bustling with thousands of people, but we have stayed out on the streets despite the fewer numbers.

A few weeks back, a couple had walked by during the preaching and had received tracts and were listening to one of the guys preach. I approached them and asked if they had ever received a gospel tract before. His name was Euan and his girlfriend's name was Jen. They are both lost but they believe in God and were open to hearing the gospel. I spoke with them for about fifteen minutes or so before they needed to go, but I was able to get their contact information. A week or so later they met with us at a park and I was able to open the Bible with them and explain the gospel fully. After about an hour or so they weren't quite ready to get saved, but they said they wanted to think on it more. We gave them both Bibles and asked them if they would read the book of John. Euan asked me why he should read that book over the other books in the Bible. I turned in the Bible over to John 20 and showed him verse 31. **John 20:31 But these are written, that ye might believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God; and that believing ye might have life through his name.** I said, "That means the book of John was written for people just like you. So that you might believe and that believing you might have eternal life." He smiled and said that now he was excited to read the book of John. Lord willing, we are hoping to meet up with them again soon since the lockdown has lifted. Please pray that Euan and Jen will read the book of John and that they will receive Jesus Christ as their Savior.

As I mentioned in my last prayer letter, our boy David got saved recently. Not long after he accepted the Lord, we set up a Sunday afternoon to get him baptized and we scheduled a time with a hotel that had a pool. When we went there for the baptism, there were some folks who were staying at the hotel who were in the pool and hot tub. We made a point to go over and give them a heads up that we were having a baptism and that we would be out of their hair in a few minutes. After the baptism I went over to a couple fellas who were sitting by the hot tub and gave them gospel tracts. It was a father and son and they seemed more than happy to take the tracts. The son was in his

thirties, and after I explained the gospel to them both, he said he was saved and told me about the time and place he had gotten saved. I turned my attention to his dad named Steve. He looked to be in his 60s or 70s and was in real poor health. I said, "What about you Steve? Are you born again?" He told me that he was raised Catholic and that he was somewhat religious, but said that he wasn't born again yet. He told me that he knew he needed to be born again but that he thought he was too sinful to get saved. I took a few minutes and explained what salvation was. I explained to him why he could never clean himself up enough to get out of hell and why he needed Jesus Christ to fix those sins of his. Near the end of the witness, I told him that most men don't have the courage to admit they are sinners let alone the guts to do something about it. He said that he was definitely a sinner but when I pressed him about getting saved he was hesitant. I told him, "Well most men won't ever get saved. Even if they know the truth. Most men aren't man enough to do something about it." He looked at me for a moment and then thought to himself before looking back at me and said, "Alright! Let's do it. Show me how to get saved!" I kneeled down next to the broken weathered man and used a chick tract to show him some Scripture and the sinner's prayer. He was quick to tell me that he had poor eye sight and didn't have his glasses on him so he couldn't read the words of the sinner's prayer. I told him I could read the words to him and that he could pray the words out loud and from his heart. He quickly agreed and prayed along with me. Big crocodile tears welled up in his eyes as he accepted Jesus Christ.
