Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

September-October 2020

Scotland is still as crazy as the rest of the world and the government here is constantly trying to force everyone to stay home and locked down. Praise the Lord, we are still able to meet for services and the street ministry has not been shut down. We would appreciate prayers that the Lord will keep the door open for services and that we can continue to evangelize and preach on the streets.

A month or so ago I got the chance to deal with a man in his twenties named Ewan. That particular Sunday, our church had been out preaching and singing on the streets, and we had had quite a few more hecklers and backlash than normal. The heckling mostly just fires all of us preachers up! There is a very unique comradery that comes with fighting for the gospel alongside other Bible believing men. When things were finally starting to settle down, Christopher got up and started preaching. I noticed a young man walking up the high street who stopped and listened to the preaching for a little while before bowing his head and praying. When he finished praying, I made a bee line to him and gave him a gospel tract. His name was Ewan and he told me that he was raised in a Roman Catholic home, but that he wasn't religious. He believed in God but he didn't know the gospel. I talked to him about salvation and asked him if he had ever prayed and asked the Lord to be his Savior. He told me about an experience that should've killed him, and said that when he woke up in the hospital he prayed and thanked God he was alive and thanked God for his mom. I said to him, "That's a good prayer, but if you're trusting in that prayer to get you to heaven then you are going go to hell like a bullet." His eyes got real big and he frantically said, "Then tell me what to pray man!!" Glory to GOD! I took him through Romans 10:9-10 and some other scripture, and at the end of it he prayed a simple sinner's prayer and believed on the Lord Jesus Christ.

In the past couple weeks, Katy has had the chance to lead two folks to the Lord on the streets. One was a girl named Jaden. She was dressed really gothic and had all the piercings and markings to go with it. She looked like she was the last person on that street looking for Jesus Christ, but she came up to the "Free Bible Literature" table and Katy was quick to start dealing with her. Katy asked her if she had ever been saved, and Jaden said that she didn't really understand all of it. Katy took her to 1 Corinthians 15:3-4 and explained to her that the gospel is simply that God's Son died for your sins, and that he was buried and rose again. She told her that she needed to put her faith in the finished work of Jesus Christ and took her through the Romans Road. Behind all the gothic makeup, Jaden began to tear up, and after a few minutes she prayed with Katy and got saved!

A week later we were back on the streets, preaching in the pouring rain. A man named Eric came up to the literature table just like Jaden had, and Katy was quick to give him a tract and started dealing with him. Eric was in his twenties and Slovakian. She gave him the gospel and right there in the pouring rain he bowed his head and got saved!

Thank you all for your faithfulness and help. We are grateful for all of the support and prayers. The Lord uses you folks to keep us here and fighting for souls, and I truly appreciate it more than you know.
